

THE CATECHETICAL CORNER



The Woman I Love

Venerable Fulton J. Sheen, one of my "Catholic heroes," gave a talk in which he began by stating, "The subject of this meditation will be, 'the woman I love'." I can only imagine the faces of those listening to him as he began his talk with these words. I am sure they thought they would get some juicy personal history. However, he guickly let his audience know that the object of his love was Mary, the Mother of God. Archbishop Sheen often spoke about Mary's role in salvation history, her significance as the mother of Jesus, and her unique qualities as a model of faith and discipleship. He emphasized Mary's virtues, such as humility, obedience, and purity, and he encouraged Catholics to emulate her example in their own lives. Why is Mary such a stumbling block for Catholics and non-Catholics alike? What does it mean to be the Mother of God? And what happened when this title was challenged?

When we call Mary the Mother of God, we are affirming her unique and exalted status among all humanity. At the Annunciation, when the angel Gabriel declared to her, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you," Mary's fiat, her resounding "yes" to God's plan, forever changed the course of history. In her womb, the Word became flesh, and Jesus Christ, true God and true man, was conceived.

However, early in the Church's history, the title of Mary as Mother of God was challenged. The heresy of Arianism was born when Arius mistakenly thought he was correct in saying that Mary is the mother of Jesus (Christotokos—Christ-bearer), not the Mother of God (Theotokos—Godbearer). Arius taught that Jesus, though the highest of all created beings, was not equal to God the Father. This belief struck at the heart of Christian doctrine, challenging the belief in the Holy Trinity and the eternal nature of Christ.

The Arian controversy shook the early Church's foundations, leading to bitter debates and divisions among Christians. Emperors and bishops weighed in on the theological disputes, and councils were convened to settle the matter.

But amidst the turmoil, the Church stood firm in its defense of the true faith. At the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD, the Church proclaimed the Nicene Creed (which we say every Sunday), affirming the divinity of Christ as "begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father." This solemn declaration refuted the errors of Arianism and reaffirmed the Church's belief in the Trinity – one God in three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Mary's motherhood reminds us of the unity between the human and divine natures in Jesus Christ. Through her, God entered our world, using our human nature to redeem us from sin and death. Mary's "yes" to God's plan paved the way for our salvation, and through her, we are brought closer to her Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

It is crucial to understand that Mary's motherhood is not merely physical but spiritual as well. She nurtured and cared for Jesus throughout his life, guiding him with love and wisdom. As the Mother of God, Mary holds a special place of honor and intercession in the Church. Just as she cared for Jesus during his earthly ministry, she continues to care for each one of us, her spiritual children, interceding for us before the throne of her Son.

Mary's role as the Mother of God also highlights the dignity of motherhood itself. Through her example, we see the selflessness, love, and sacrifice inherent in the vocation of motherhood. Every mother shares in Mary's calling to nurture and raise her children with love and faith.

In May, we honor Mary as the Mother of God with hearts full of gratitude and devotion. Let us turn to her in times of need, confident that she intercedes for us before the throne of her Son. And let us strive to imitate her faith, humility, and obedience in our lives so that, like her, we may always be open to God's will and cooperate with his grace.

First Reading: Acts 1:1-11; Second Reading: Eph 1:17-23 or Eph 4:1-13 or 4:1-7, 11-13; Gospel: Mk 16:15-20


We celebrate today one more step in the completion of the mission of the Son of God. Humanity had sinned at the beginning of time and fallen from Original Innocence. God immediately began to prepare the world for the gift of eternal redemption by establishing a covenant with Noah, Abraham and Moses. He raised up various prophets and kings to further prepare His people for what was to come. And then, when the time was right, God entered our world through the Blessed Virgin Mary. Jesus, the Son of God, eventually entered into His public ministry, teaching, performing miracles, gathering the faithful to Himself, dying, rising and then appearing to His disciples in preparation for the Ascension. The Ascension completes the mission of the Son of God. The Ascension was the end of Jesus' life on Earth but also the beginning of our sharing in the life of Heaven. As Jesus ascended, He commissioned His disciples to go forth and "preach the gospel to every creature." They were to preach to all about the saving plan of God that began at the time of Adam and Eve and was completed with the Ascension.

Reflect, today, upon your calling to not only share in this glorious moment of Jesus' Ascension but also your calling to go forth and to do all you can to draw others into this new life. Reflect upon Jesus, Who also speaks to you today to invite you to bring others to that mountain.
